AQA Religious Studies Specification A

The exam has 4 sections. Each section has a common five-part questions structure, consisting of 1, 2, 4, 5 and 12 marks. Each examination tests their knowledge and understanding and their application of their knowledge.

Paper 1- Christianity and Islam (1hr 45mins)

The exam has 4 sections:

- Christian beliefs
- Christian practices
- o Islamic beliefs
- o Islamic practices

Language Paper 2- Ethical themes (1hr 45mins)

Studies from the from the Christian and non- religious perspective The exam has 4 sections:

- $\circ \quad \text{Relationships and families}$
- o Religion and life
- Religion, peace and conflict
- o Religion, crime and punishment

- Help them learn their key word definitions word for word and keep testing them


Religious Studies home learning will typically be one of the following tasks:


- 1) To complete a practice exam questions

- 4) Seneca work


Students who regularly complete their Religious Studies home learning to a high standard are far more likely to succeed than those who do not.


