Welcome back, I hope you have had an amazing summer break and you are well rested. The pupils have now been back for their first week and have settled into their routines extremely well. The new Year R and 7 have been tremendous, already measuring up to our Trinity Standard and our extremely high expectations. It does take a bit of time to adjust to the new routines, but it is always fantastic to see how quickly this happens. Can I take this opportunity to welcome all the new parents to our Trinity family? Your child's education is at the heart of everything we do. Together we will help shape your sons / daughters aspirations and futures. You are an extremely important part in this process.

We have started to roll out the Trinity School App. Initially it is out for the parents and pupils of the pupils in year 7 upwards. All parents of pupils in year 7 upwards should have received an email giving you information on how to download and sign into the App. If you have not yet received this please contact the school office (do check your inbox and junk box in case you have received it and not noticed it yet). This App can be used on all mobile devises, tablets and can be accessed on any Personal Computer Desktop (via an internet browser). All pupils in Year 7 upwards have also been issued a letter this morning by their Family Group Leader which gives them access to their school email account. When they open their email account they will find an email waiting for them to help them sign up to their own version of the App. The App is growing and will give parents and pupil's direct access to all personal school reports, timetables, attendance data, and homework issued and will enable you to directly contact via message your child's teachers. All school communication will be pushed through the App as well. Do not worry parents of pupils in Year R- 6, you too will be included before Christmas – we just needed to phase this in to ensure it is working smoothly. It may have a few teething issues to start with, but please do call the office if you have any questions. Exciting times.

All pupils across the school will be using Knowledge Organisers (KO) throughout their time at Trinity. These are used within the classroom for pupils in year R-6 and are taken home once pupils get into year 7 and above. If I could ask all parents of pupils in year 7 and above to ask their son / daughter to show you their KO and please do spend some time reading the introduction together. These booklets are for use right up until Christmas (and another booklet will be given to all pupils in January). Homework for all pupils with these KO is to learn the information off by heart from these booklets. Knowledge is power. Your support is required.

May we have courage to live good lives,


So that we are outstanding Trinitarians.

Please also make sure there are no nuts or nut based products, such as Nutella or Nutella Bars.






UPDATE OF FORMER PUPIL'S PROGRESS

RESULTS DAY 2019 - A JOYFUL DAY FOR OUR YEAR 11s



CLASS OF 2019

Well done to Trinity Year 11 class of 2019 on their tremendous achievements this year. Pupils were delighted with their results and are now ready to move onto the next step of their academic journey and as a truly comprehensive school we are extremely pleased with the achievements we have seen all pupils make regardless of prior attainment and background. A wide range of subjects from Chinese to Computer Science achieved a pass rate of 100% Grade 8 and above and many pupils of the cohort were moving onto today to complete their enrolment at a wide range of Post 16 provision including grammar schools and scholarships at Independent schools (the highest number we have ever had this year). All pupils are carrying on with studying and have achieved their target grades for A Level courses. We also have pupils going onto apprenticeships, Level 3 vocational qualifications and combined A Level with vocational courses.

We would like to especially commend pupils who have done particularly well in their achievement of a range of top grades – Abdulmalek with 2 grade 9's and 3 grade 8's amongst other excellent results. Solomon with 2 grade 9's and 4 grade 8's, Taliq with 4 grade 9's and 3 grade 8's. Our Head Girl, Janelle, with 1 grade 9, 3 grade8's and 3 grade 7's. Janielle leaves to take up her scholarship place at Lancing this year (See page 5) along with Cindy-Ann who achieved 3 grade 8's and 5 grade 7's. Well done girls on these amazing results and it is no surprise that Lancing College this year gave Trinity two full scholarships with boarding as they were so impressed with you at interview.

We also send congratulations to the many ex Trinitarians who have completed their 6th form time and are now heading off to university, amongst them Jamie Cuthbert who with 4 A* is a terrific example of the success that hard work and dedication can bring you – we count you amongst our successes as well!!.

Firstly, the new Year 7s are here and they are transitioning into the school. I've witnessed people from older years helping the year 7s find their lessons and their way around the school which embodies what we as a school want to be known as a welcoming, caring group of pupils and staff.

An assumption is made that Year 11 is a scary year, a year of stress and anxiety to do well; but it's key to remember we have great teachers to support us every step of the way and as long as we put the effort in to revise and work hard, GCSE's will be a lot easier to get through.
