Dear Trinitarians

Life has changed over the last few months in many ways. During this unprecedented time our community really has pulled together and we have achieved a significant amount. We are really grateful for the support from the community and are really appreciative of all the thanks given back to us for the work we have done. It really has been a team effort, and yes there has been some ups and downs along the way, but I am extremely grateful and proud of the Trinity family. The pupils positive attitude, the continual support and talent of our parents and the relentless planning and drive from the staff have held us all together. Just to name but a few of our achievements:

- Pupils developed more independent skills and continued to progress at home – a full home learning package was created and adapted due to feedback
- Parents fully supported their children in their learning at home whilst working and doing all the other things parents have to do...
- The school managed to contact all our families throughout this period, with regular contact reaching out to support our whole community
- Teachers have developed their teaching practice trialling out new strategies to engage pupils and families at home
- Staff have worked hard to plan for welcoming more pupils back at school – we are the only school across the whole borough that enabled all primary pupils to return for some face-to-face learning before the summer holiday. We were also the only school to offer 4 weeks of face-to-face learning for our year 10 pupils across the borough.
- Our staff have planned fully for the return of all pupils come September – so that the building and the curriculum is fully ready for learning at the start of September.

My list is not exhaustive, we have achieved so much. At the end of the school year we are saying goodbye to 2 members of staff. Ms Kyriakides is leaving us and going on an adventure of her own. We really will miss her amazing positivity, dedication, drive for improvement and love for our whole community. Mr Omar is also leaving us and will be missed by staff and pupils for his passion and drive with so many different languages. We wish them both well in their future plans. This year we therefore have just under 2% staff turnover, when the average is 15%. The staff at Trinity are an amazing bunch of people, dedicated to continue to develop and enhance the learning journey of all our pupils.

This week a series of letters have been posted out to all families informing them of the start of September arrangements. Each year group is a different bubble so will have slightly different information – so this letter is extremely important. We have put all the letters on our website in case you need it – but please do ask if you need anything clarified. It is important that you read these with your son / daughter so that they understand the expectations for when they arrive. The new year R and 7 pupils will be coming in on the Thursday and Friday, 3rd and 4th of September, for induction. All pupils will then return on Monday 7th of September – please look at the letters for the exact time window you need to arrive in and which entrance you need to arrive at.

Part of a schools continuous journey is to say goodbye to some pupils and welcome others into our school. We had a wonderful celebration event for our year 6 pupils this week. A huge thank you to PAFT for helping organise this. The majority will still be with us in September, but leaving Primary is still an important milestone. Our year 11 pupils will be back in August to collect their results and we will be running a celebration breakfast for them on this day. We will also do more celebrations when we can. Once a member of the Trinity family always a member. Come September we will be welcoming pupils to our reception and year 7 classes - Our family continues to grow.

As we reflect on this school year I think we can safely say that the events that transpired were wholly unexpected and there were many twists and turns. 2019/20 was always due to be a significant year for Trinity as it was the year the school finally joined up with children from year Reception to Year 11. When the Primary phase opened 7 years ago, it contained 60 very small children about to start their Trinity journey. It is now full and bustling and we are delighted that over 75% of those children now in year 6 will be transitioning to Trinity Secondary to start the next part of their educational journey. As Governors we wish all these children and those going on to pastures new the best of luck in the future.

The school year started normally with lots of progress in learning led by our amazing SLT who have worked incredibly hard this year to build and embed an all through curriculum. Corona virus certainly threw us a curve ball which made us have to adapt quickly and smartly. I would like to thank Mr Lucas and his whole staff not only for their hard work and extraordinary endeavours to get home learning set up and operational so quickly, but also for their pastoral care of all children, especially those of our amazing key workers, whose parents are working on the front line. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the key workers who worked throughout the pandemic and to the school which has remained open throughout to support them.

The Governing Board would like to thank Mr Lucas and his whole staff for making it possible for as many children to return to school as possible. At the primary this was offered to all the children on a part time basis, which was an amazing feat as most schools could only support a few years return. It has been wonderful to hear the news of each new year group being welcomed back. We also want to wish our incredible Year 11s a very fond farewell and hope that they will all be awarded the grades they deserve and have worked so hard for. We wish them every success in their future destinations. We look forward to seeing what they all achieve next. We are so sorry that our year 6's and 11's haven't had the usual celebratory send offs, but they will always be remembered as extremely resilient young people.

The Governing Board has been involved in all the plans made for the return to school and continues to meet regularly. We are monitoring the return of each year group and reviewing the risks the school has to mitigate to ensure the safe return of children into the building. Throughout the pandemic, Mr Lucas has done detailed logistical planning to ensure the safety of all children and staff. Having just read the extremely detailed September plan for welcoming all years back to school on a full time basis, I want to thank Mr Lucas for all the time he has spent on this. We would also like to say a big thank you to the site premises teams for all their hard work and commitment in making the school a safe place for everyone.

In addition to the Covid 19 planning, the Governors and school have decided that rightful attention regarding recent events and the Black Lives Matter movement needs to be examined within our school community. Our ethos has always been welcoming and respectful to all, however there is always more work that can be done. To that end we have quickly begun to form a working group to explore the many issues specifically facing people of colour. We will be ensuring that our curriculum, ethos and environment is focused where it needs to be. This group has already met and will continue to do so next academic year to retain focus on what will always be an area where we have to be mindful.



Amazon Web Services (AWS), the cloud computing part of Amazon. AWS are passionate about introducing more young people, especially girls to the possibility of a career in technology and improving communication and education around diversity within the technology industry.

We are incredibly excited to announce the third year of AWS GetIT, a fully funded programme for schools in the UK for 2020/21.

We would like to invite your school to take part in this programme and give your Year 8 students the unique opportunity to connect with inspiring female leaders in the IT industry, explore a career in technology and gain valuable employability skills.

What is AWS GetIT?

AWS GetIT is an initiative designed to encourage more girls to consider a career in tech, challenging long-standing gender stereotypes within industry.

AWS GetIT invites teams from different schools to enter an app-building competition to solve real issues faced by their school or community. Along the way, participants are supported by a dedicated AWS female ambassador and learn practical digital and IT skills. They experience working as a team, gain self-confidence by presenting ideas to wider audiences and all while being exposed to IT as a potential career.

Since AWS GetIT's launch in 2018, the program has captured young people's imaginations and grown rapidly. By the end of 2020, we will have worked with over 22,000 students and 136 schools. The diversity of our competition submissions reflects the varied issues and pressures facing young people today. App concepts range from managing stress and mental health, encouraging consumption of recyclable products and planning revision and schoolwork.

Timeline Overview:

- **September - October 2020:** AWS Female Ambassador delivers an inspiring assembly at your school on an agreed date.
- **September - October 2020:** Participating students and teachers download the 'Challenge and Teacher pack' to start independently designing their app.
- **October - November 2020:** Participating student teams are invited to a GetIT one day bootcamp at the AWS offices in London.
- **January - February 2021:** Teams receive an in-school visit from their AWS ambassador to support students with their projects and give feedback.
- **March-April 2021:** Teams submit their ideas and selected teams are invited to present their apps at the AWS Summit in London.

To take part, we ask each school to appoint a lead member of staff as a point of contact to ensure smooth coordination of activities, as well as a backup contact. There is no cost to schools participating, except arranging travel to events at AWS. If this is a major barrier to participation, we have a bursary your school can apply for to support travel expenses which we will



Who is eligible?

While this programme is aimed at girls, we welcome boys as well as we are keen for everyone to be aware of the opportunities in the technology industry, and to challenge the gender stereotypes. Just 25% of IT jobs are held by women today and AWS GetIT aims to readdress the balance and drive diversity and inclusion into IT. For this reason, we ask that all teams must have a gender balance of at least 50 % girls to qualify.

We are factoring in social distancing and making plan, but assemblies won't start until October as we want to scope the situation and allow schools to get back to the 'new normal' - online assemblies will be an option.

To take part, we ask each school to appoint a lead member of staff as a point of contact to ensure smooth coordination of activities, as well as a backup contact. There is no cost to schools participating, except arranging travel to events at AWS. If this is a major barrier to participation, we have a bursary your school can apply for to support travel expenses which we will share with you closer to the time.


