

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER By Reverend Juliet Evans

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness,

Where for forty days he was tempted by the devil.

He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry.

The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread."

Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone.'" Luke 4: 1-4

In Trinity this week we are reflecting on Jesus being tested and tempted in the wilderness. In worship we have been thinking about what tempts us and persuades our behaviour to be good or to be bad. One of the things we have noticed is that it is not our temptations which are a problem it is how we act on them which matters. After his time in the wilderness, Jesus knew the importance of not giving into temptations. Jesus taught his followers how to pray by teaching them the Lord's Prayer, which includes the line 'lead us not into temptation and deliver us from evil'. This reflects Jesus' time and experience in the wilderness and is a reminder to us that praying is important to keep us connected to God and connected to living good lives.

This Lent, help us to grow in faith, prayer and wisdom.

Amen





Has your child any allergies, medical conditions or newly diagnosed conditions that we need to be aware of?





Hi there


Year 7 learn from an architect and design consultant

Admitting to not being particularly academic, Cherry showed pupils how having a goal, being determined and being prepared to work hard and be resilient will help you achieve in life. Cherry shared some of her past and current design projects, pupils had a chance to ask lots of questions and to look through her portfolio folder which includes a design for work in Catford.

Sir Martyn Lewis




It was a pleasure to host Sir Martyn Lewis who spoke to year 9 and 10 about his career in media and news. He spoke about the many people he has interviewed across the world and shared some valuable insights into how the world of media is changing today. He is currently a champion for constructive journalism and spoke passionately about his involvement in the campaign to get the world's media to share the positive as well as the negative news stories. He gave a warning and some advice on fake news and encouraged pupils to check that sources are reliable before believing what you read.

In addition Sir Martyn spoke about the volunteering sector and made reference to the Envision programme which some of our year 10s are involved in. He encouraged young people to get involved in their community and reach out to the world around them, for their own benefit as well as the benefit of others.



TRINITY STUDENTS – CHARITY APPRENTICE PROJECT

A group of our Year 10s continued their charity apprentice project with Envision by taking a trip up to Chancery Lane to WSP, one of the world's leading engineering professional services firms. Overview
 On this session, you should focus on how to best fundraising skills in your office and practice this presentation to date.

FAQS
 Are there any live skills you need today? What is the first skill you need? What are the white and the blue students used to be encouraged?

Energiser
 Start to start thinking and discussing the complete and complete your team.

Final plans for fundraising stalls
 The young people will receive you will show the first three or four fundraising ideas and they will get into small groups for each idea. This is to guide the young people with the different techniques (why, what, when, how, who) plus encourage all of the Y10s to take responsibility for at least one task.
 Y10s to write their responsibilities in their own words.
 By the end of this session they should have a comprehensive "to do" list with their roles, responsibilities and resources.
 If there is time you will do a problem solving Q&A with the young people where you think of possible issues they may encounter on the day and encourage Y10s to think of ways they will overcome these issues.

Presentation skills
 To begin this activity please talk to your young people about your experience of public speaking. Include a time that went badly and what you learnt. Include how you overcome any nerves and how you best prepare for presenting.

Top tips
 Y10s and Y11s in small groups to write top tips for public speaking and managing nerves

- Some clues if you get stuck
- Speak slowly and clearly
- Use your hands to express yourself
- Move around the stage
- Practice
- Remember nobody knows what you've written in the script and nobody will know if you make a mistake
