Many young people do not have an accessible forum in which they can express their safety concerns to those with the power to implement systemic change. Our Safety Conferences provide a platform for young people to express their safety concerns; ensuring young people lead on the planning and delivery of positive social action.

For Jimmy builds connected communities, through facilitating a space in which a wide range of community members interact and build understanding, empathy and trust. This year's Safety Conferences in Deptford and Lewisham brought together young people from 15 different schools to meet with members of Lewisham Council, the police force and the business community.



THINGS TO DO AROUND LONDON

About the Grant Museum of Zoology

The Grant Museum of Zoology is one of the oldest natural history collections in the UK, and is the last remaining university natural history museum in London. Home to 68,000 zoological specimens, the collection is a unique window on the entire animal kingdom.

The collection contains specimens from a number of former university collections such as Imperial College London and Queen Mary University of London in addition to material from London Zoo and various London hospital comparative anatomy collections. The museum also has specimens from the collections of Thomas Henry Huxley, Karl Pearson, Victor Negus and Doris Mackinnon, and material from the Discovery Expedition and Challenger Expedition. The collection contains a wide range of material including: fluid preserved, pinned entomology, taxidermy, freeze-dried and skeletal specimens. Bring along your budding zoologists for our family hands-on specimen based activities and be inspired by our collections and enthusiastic museum educators. Come along and be amazed at the natural world.

Drop in between 1pm and 4pm, this event is free and there is no need to book.



Planning your visit

Entry to the museum is free. We are open Monday - Saturday 12.00-17.00 (including bank holidays).

The museum is closed for Christmas between 22 December 2015 - 1 January 2016 and Easter between 17 April - 22 April 2016.

We are open for group and research visits on weekday mornings 10am - 1pm, when advanced booking is required.

The museum welcomes family visitors warmly. Children, however young, as well as adults get a great deal out of their visits but please note that children under 11 must be accompanied by an adult.

Any groups of ten or more must book in advance. This is to avoid clashes - the museum is used for a number of purposes and isn't suited to more than one large group at once.

Access to the museum, and all public areas within it, is step-free. There is a shallow ramp leading up to the main entrance from the street.

STREET ART FOR THE COOL KIDS

You just have to start here - with the luminous, tacky, glorious God's Own Junkyard neon shrine in Walthamstow. A huge warehouse-sized assemblage of vintage signs and neon lights are part of the collection of the late artist Chris Bracey, who eventually ended up making neon props for Hollywood directors. There are religious statues, disco balls, and neon signs aplenty all for sale or for rent, and a cafe on site.



We are open weekends : Friday - 11am to 9pm Saturday - 11am to 9pm Sunday - 11am to 6pm.
The Rolling Scenes Cafe is open for food and drinks all week end.

Next, try the Leake Street graffiti tunnel under Waterloo Station, which is the largest legal street art area and home to original Banksy works as well as an ever-changing display of talented graffiti artists. There are plans to regenerate the area and the arches in the tunnel are set to house pop-ups, a sensory space and bars and cafes, but until then, it's a thrilling place to wander on your way to street food stalls outside the Royal Festival Hall.


