Dear Trinitarians

All funds raised are used to help improve the schools facilities. The PAFT team have worked tirelessly behind the scene to ensure the event is packed with entertainment and fun for all. Our pupils are working extremely hard as we are moving towards the end of year exams – retrieval practice is being used to support all with their memory. Year 11 have their final full week of public exams next week and all other year groups are being prepped ready for their opportunity to show us everything they have learnt.

We have had many pupils over the last week receive their UK Intermediate National Maths Challenge results. We achieved two gold awards for Edward Lindsey and Patrick Meehan, two silver for Patience Ambella Safi and Alliyah James and 7 bronze awards. We also had a group of pupils take park in the UK National Junior Challenge with Kemar Herman achieving a Silver and 10 others gaining a bronze award. Again our pupils took part in the Lewisham Athletics champions and we had 22 top 3 finishers. 5 of our pupils will now go on and represent Lewisham at the London School Games at the end of June.

We are about to launch our Activities week programme for all pupils in year 7 to 10 - where they will be able to pick activities that fully immerse them in activities that is different to what they would normally do. This includes Engineering programmes, Drama workshops, music performance and Taize.

Over the last few weeks, children have worked with the Jimmy Mizen team: developing self image, building confidence and placing value on their peers.



You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. Acts 1: 8-9
